Put On the New Man

"And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness." *Ephesians 4:24*

"David encouraged himself in the LORD his God." (1 Samuel 30:6)

Every child of God needs to learn to encourage himself in the LORD his God. This is true because every child of God will at some time as he goes through this sin cursed world meet with discouragement. David was discouraged because he felt responsible for the loss of not only his family but the families of all of his men. He had led his army away from their camp, leaving them left to be prey for the Amalekites. His men who were loyal to him were so grieved for the loss of their families that they spoke of stoning him.

What does he do in such a sad situation, when he and his men were so discouraged? He turned to the LORD his God to encourage himself. None of us will ever be discouraged because of the things that discouraged David, but there are many other causes which may discourage us. We all face sickness, disappointment, loneliness, being misunderstood by family and friends, and a host of other troubles.

How did he encourage himself in "the LORD his God?"

Did he remind himself of "the tender mercies" of the LORD his God?

Did he remind himself of God's everlasting covenant of grace?

Did he remind himself of the truth: "the LORD is my Shepherd, I shall not want?"

Did he remind himself that nothing is impossible for "the LORD his God?

Did he remind himself that "the LORD his God" is able to bring good out of evil, which He soon did?

We soon read: "David recovered all".

We are not told how David "encouraged himself in the LORD his God", but we do know that there is never a lack of truths in the LORD our God with which we may encourage ourselves.

None of us are beyond temptation. None of us are beyond weakness. None of us are beyond sin. There is nothing we would not do, and completely justify ourselves in doing it, if the Lord left us to ourselves for a moment

If Baptism Does Not Save, Why is it Important?

Baptism is a ceremony, and nothing more. There is no saving efficacy in it nor is it a means through which grace is conveyed. But, that does not take away from its importance.

The marriage ceremony does not cause a man and woman to love one another. They love each other before they participated in the marriage ceremony. But if they refuse to participate in the marriage ceremony, and live together without it, they say by that, that they do not love one another enough to be totally committed to one another. This shows how important the marriage ceremony is. There is no true love without it.

Baptism is the same. It does not cause salvation. It speaks of a relationship that was already there before the ceremony. And that relationship was caused by what baptism depicts: Union with Christ. For someone to refuse Baptism is like someone who refuses the marriage covenant and ceremony. That person says by their actions, "I do not love Christ enough to commit to Him." Love like that is not love at all!

Yes, Baptism is important – "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16).

Thus, in God's mysterious providence, those who have every reason to fear have for the most part no fear at all, and those who have no reason whatever to fear, but stand complete in Christ, the objects of God's eternal love, and the sheep for whom Jesus died, are the only persons who are plagued and pestered with the fears that spring from their own unbelieving hearts, and the temptations with which Satan is continually distressing their minds. It is the object of Satan to keep those secure who are safe in his hands... So that whilst those who have no work of grace upon their hearts at all are left secure, and free from doubt and fear, those in whom God is at work are exercised and troubled in their minds, and often cannot really believe that they are the people in whom God takes delight.
